

- (e) Members of the Leadership Weakley County Class of 2016 shall comprise the initial group of members (charter members) for WCYP. The Charter Members are subject to all terms and conditions listed herein.

3rd Annual Minerals Day

October 6, 2017

The City of Gleason invites everyone to the Third Annual Minerals Day celebration in Gleason, TN. Last year was a phenomenal event as an estimated 800 people attended the party. This year promises to be the best yet now that Minerals Day has become a true community event. The Gleason Downtown Revitalization Committee (GDRC) is taking the reins for this year's extravaganza and realizes the importance of clay minerals in our cities, towns, and state.

Several local "mineral" producers have agreed to sponsor this year's event. Old Hickory Clay Company, Gleason Clay Company, and Imerys Ceramics / Kentucky-Tennessee Clay Company are already on board to help educate the community about the magic of West Tennessee Ball Clay. Many other supporting local service industries are interested in helping us make the day possible, and we expect a huge turnout. Many government and industrial officials have attended in the past and we anticipate more this year.

A few changes are in store for this year's event, but, as usual, the invitation is extended to all people interested in learning how ball clay makes the world go round. Old Hickory Clay Company has graciously agreed to let the public tour a mine, weather permitting. Minerals Day will be held Friday, October 6, 2017, from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm at Mike Snider Park, 506 North Cedar Street, Gleason, TN. Many pieces of equipment such as excavators, dozers, articulated truck, and the world famous "Gleason Shredder" will be on site. The GDRC and local businesses will be providing hotdogs, chips, snow cones, popcorn, cotton candy, and cold drinks for refreshments.

Again, everyone is welcome, but due to large turnout last year, we ask that school groups, and any group of 20 or more, RSVP no later than noon October 2nd to ensure everyone gets fed. School groups will need to provide bus transportation for the mine tour. Small capacity busses will run on a tight schedule for the general public.

The sign on the edge of Gleason's city limits reads "Welcome to Gleason: Ball Clay Mining Center of the Nation." Weakley County's deposit of the finest quality ball clay, which is used for china, porcelain, pottery, and other purposes, is shipped all over the world.

The first clay was dug in 1926, from testing on the W. R. Crawford farm, two miles west of Gleason. A tenant on the farm discovered the deposit by accident while building a fence. A spring on the side of a bluff contained traces of clay and the owner had the mineral examined. Some of the richest veins of clay in the area were discovered in a 20-acre plot. The Bell Clay Company started operations immediately with 25 men working pond scoops and horses to remove the overburden of dirt and debris. Holes were dug with hand augers, dynamite placed within exploded and workers dug the clay out with picks and shovels. Afterwards, the clay was loaded on wagons or trucks and hauled to the railroad to be shipped all over the world. Today, over 90 years later, multiple clay companies have continued to expand this industry throughout the area.
